



PALLIATIVE CARE AFFIRMS LIFE AND REGARDS DEATH AS A NORMAL PROCESS












MYTHS AND MISCONCEPTIONS

- Palliative Care is only for those who are dying
- Palliative Care is only for those who have no chance for cure
- Palliative Care means giving up hope
- Patients who choose palliative care die faster
- Pain relief from palliative care creates addiction

- Approaching Death: Improving Care at the End of Life 2014
- Incorporates
 - Latest research
 - Technologies
 - Affordable Care Act legislation and initiatives
 - Increased focus on quality

Importing Quality and Determing Index that Performance New Or End of Life

PROFESSIONAL EDUCATION & DEVELOPMENT

- Palliative care knowledge gains have not transferred to most clinicians caring for people with advanced serious illness
- Palliative care generally absent from the usual curricula of medical and nursing schools
 - Single professional silos

RECOMMENDATIONS

- All clinicians across disciplines who care for people with serious illness
 - should be competent in basic palliative care, including communication
- Educational institutions and professional societies should provide training in palliative care throughout professional's career;
- Accrediting organizations should require palliative care education and clinical experience in programs for all specialties



RECOMMENDATIONS

- Include palliative care in certification & licensure requirements
- Create pathways for palliative care training


